Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Free Chlorine

Our water system violated several drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the weeks of 8/16/20, 9/6/20, 9/27/20, 11/22/20 and 11/29/20 we failed to monitor for the following contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, the required sampling frequency, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which corrective action samples were (or will be) taken.

Contaminant	Required sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken	When samples were or will be taken
Free Chlorine (1013)	Monthly	15 total	15 total per month; at least 1 per week	15 total per month; at least 1 per week

What happened? What was done? When will it be resolved?

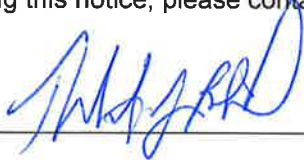
The Authority is required to monitor residual disinfectant concentration at 15 locations in the distribution system per month with at least one location per week. In 2020, the Authority monitored the 15 locations per month, however, during the weeks of 8/16, 9/6, 9/27, 11/22 and 11/29, the Authority failed to monitor at least 1 location. Authority personnel were properly trained and informed of the regulations to avoid any reoccurrences.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
